Thanks!

Traffic and Parking Bruce Johnson, new Senior Engineering Tech with KCMO Public Works, answered questions about permit parking at the October neighborhood meeting. He also consulted with SW Area Rep Patrick Faltico on parking and resident John Pearse on traffic calming. As a result, we now have a responsive city contact on these matters.

Petitions to establish permit parking on the 3900 to 4200 blocks of Terrace and Wyoming are under review at the city. The review will determine whether a hearing is needed. This effort will freeup street parking now occupied by KU commuters.

In addition, a one-day traffic study has been done at the corner of 41st and Roanoke (that's the one where a guy actually sits in his car and counts traffic). Results will determine whether a full-blown study is needed.

Your Priorities

Also at the October neighborhood meeting, we asked you to rank neighborhood priorities. Here's what you told us. The top priorities were Commercial Development (staying on top of what's happening and making sure neighborhood views are taken into account), Permit Parking (people in additional areas feel the need to deal with commuter parking), and a Volker Traffic Study. Slightly lower were efforts to work with KUMC and design considerations for infill housing. We will continue ongoing efforts on these and other needs, tapping some of you to get involved. Tell us how you can help at info@volkerna.org or 816 809-2557. Though not discussed, crime is a priority for many. In Volker this issue has primarily been addressed by Kara Werner of Volker Watch and the West 39th Street CID. Don't miss Volker's January all-about-crime neighborhood meeting with KCPD and others taking action on this issue.
