#### Remembering

Dutch Newman, one of the founders of the Volker Neighborhood Association, passed away on July 26 at the age of 95. She was active in local politics from the 1940's on, well-respected and loved by people at all levels. She was always ready to help others. Dutch was running again for Democratic Committeewoman 5th Ward at the time of her death. **Sidewalks** KCMO Citizen Satisfaction Surveys say sidewalks are a high priority but satisfaction is low. That would be no surprise to many Volker residents. Efforts are now underway to find new solutions to sidewalk repair. The current system puts the burden on the property owner to pay what can be thousands of dollars, leaving sidewalks in many areas to go unrepaired year after year. In some parts of the city, there are no sidewalks at all – including Bell Street north of 35<sup>th</sup> Terrace.

The good news is there is now a push inside City Hall led by Councilman/Mayor Pro Tem Scott Wagner to begin chipping away at the \$1 billion backlog with a proposed general obligation bond issue. But first the city has to adopt new policies and processes to make that possible. Midtown KC Post, BikeWalkKC, and Whole Person who together brought sidewalk issues to the attention of City Hall are now helping to gather stakeholder feedback and find new approaches. **Volker Traffic** Continuing resident concerns about speeding, reckless driving, accidents, and violations at intersections in several parts of the neighborhood have prompted the Volker Neighborhood Association to submit an application for City PIAC funding for a comprehensive traffic study. Such a study would provide a solid basis for future applications on specific hotspots and help us avoid pushing problems from one area to another. **The Loretto** A proposal to convert The Loretto into a boutique hotel was presented at the May 12<sup>th</sup> VNA General Meeting by developer Matthew Comfort of the Behringer Lodging Group. The meeting, in the chapel of The Loretto, included an extensive question and answer period to hear input and concerns.

The main concerns centered around possible impacts on traffic, noise and parking. With a proposed main lobby on the west side of the building, automobiles would enter from 39<sup>th</sup> Street and continue on the premises around to the west entrance. All parking would be on the hotel property.

Preliminary plans are for 120 rooms with a restaurant and lobby open to community residents. The historic exterior would be retained as well as the "front lawn" with possible landscaping to make it more park-like.

Beringer Lodging Group also owns the historic Chase Park Plaza Hotel in St. Louis. They envision The Loretto as an upscale hotel uniquely reflecting Kansas City character and giving visitors a chance to interact with area residents. Sale of the property has not been completed. Construction would take another 18-24 months.

The Loretto, built by the Sisters of Loretto in 1904 as a school for girls, is a historic landmark of the Volker Neighborhood. This project would assure it is well-maintained and serves the area for a longtime to come.



# Volker Yard of the Month

The August Yard of the Month award goes to Matthew Bertalott whose south facing yard at 822 W. 40th looks great even after a scorching week of near 100 F. temps. 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These 1940 tax photos are of the church at **3931-3933 Genessee** and the affiliated pastor's residence next door. The congregation and pastor moved away several years ago, and the properties had seriously deteriorated.

These two buildings are now being razed. The project architect contacted the VNA Board to present plans for a single-family house and a duplex to replace these buildings. The plans called for both to have prominent front-facing garage doors (six in a row!) with a large expanse of concrete for the driveways facing the street. The project is now being redesigned. No further information is available at this time, but the VNA board made clear that front porches with garage doors in the back or at least on the side is preferable in this neighborhood.

Stained glass windows and other materials are being salvaged during the demolition process. — *Diane Capps*
